High Risk Emergency Medicine is a course designed to address those topics that, due to the risk of misdiagnosis or misadventure, produce the greatest anxiety and concern in the daily practice of emergency medicine.

This includes practicing emergency physicians as well as internists, family practitioners, and others who practice in an urgent care, high-risk, or emergency department setting.

#### EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

- Describe strategies to reduce errors and improve care of patients with cardiac, traumatic, infectious, neurologic, and toxicologic emergencies;
- Describe strategies to reduce errors and improve care of patients with respiratory, ophthalmologic, geriatric, pregnancy related, psychiatric, and endocrinologic emergencies;
- Describe strategies to reduce bias and racism in patient care.
